ENTERTAINMENT HEALTH INSURANCE SOLUTIONS

Entertainment Health Insurance Solutions (EHIS) is a joint program of the Entertainment Community Fund and MPTF that offers California residents in the entertainment community personalized counseling and enrollment support. They also offer free educational workshops.

BEHIND THE SCENES FOUNDATION

The <u>Behind the Scenes Foundation</u> (BTS) is a non-profit that issues grants to <u>Entertainment Technology Professionals</u>, or their immediate dependent family, in need due to serious illness or injury that may be used for basic living, medical or funeral expenses. They also issue counseling grants to assist with the costs of



seeing a therapist or in-patient or out-patient rehabilitation. Assistance is only in cases of serious illness or injury. BTS is unable to assist those out of work due to a strike unless applicants are ill or injured. Entertainment Technology Professionals include jobs such as camera operators, grips, gaffers, riggers, special effects, set decorators, costumers, and hair & makeup artists. Individuals who are dealing with illness or injury whose jobs are not listed above should contact BTS to see whether they are eligible before completing an application. HOLLYWOOD SUPPORT STAFF RELIEF FUND (HSSRF)

HSSRF offers a one-time emergency financial assistance grant for film and television assistants or support staff who are currently unemployed or on hiatus due to work stoppage and have under three years of paid work experience in the entertainment industry. To apply for a grant, click HERE.

COVERED CALIFORNIA (health insurance marketplace)

Covered California is a free service that connects Californians with brand-name health insurance under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. It's the only place where you can get financial help when you buy health insurance from well-known companies. That means when you apply, you may qualify for a discount on a health plan through Covered California, or get health insurance through the state's Medi-Cal program. Either way, you'll have great health coverage.

NEW YORK STATE OF HEALTH (health insurance marketplace)

You and your family have many low-cost, quality health insurance options available through the Individual Marketplace via the New York State of Health website. You can quickly compare health plan options and apply for assistance that could lower the cost of your health coverage. You may also qualify for health care coverage from Medicaid or Child Health Plus through

COBRA COVERAGE (health insurance continuation coverage)

When you lose job-based health insurance, you may be offered Federal and/or State COBRA continuation coverage. Premiums are generally 102% of your total premium that was paid by you and your employer or union. COBRA is intended to be a temporary way to continue coverage while you find a new job or other health insurance options. I recommend contacting your health insurance provider long before your coverage ends to inquire about your particular situation.



UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION BENEFITS & STATE RESOURCES

Depending on your situation, you may be eligible for Unemployment Compensation Benefits while you are unemployed and/or looking for work. Check with your state's unemployment benefits website for more information. If eligible, unemployment benefits are generally effective when you apply for them (after a 7-day waiting period), so do not wait.

"In most states, including California, employees on strike are not entitled to unemployment insurance benefits because they are still considered employed. One exception is that employees in New York can file for unemployment after a two-week waiting period." - LA Times
